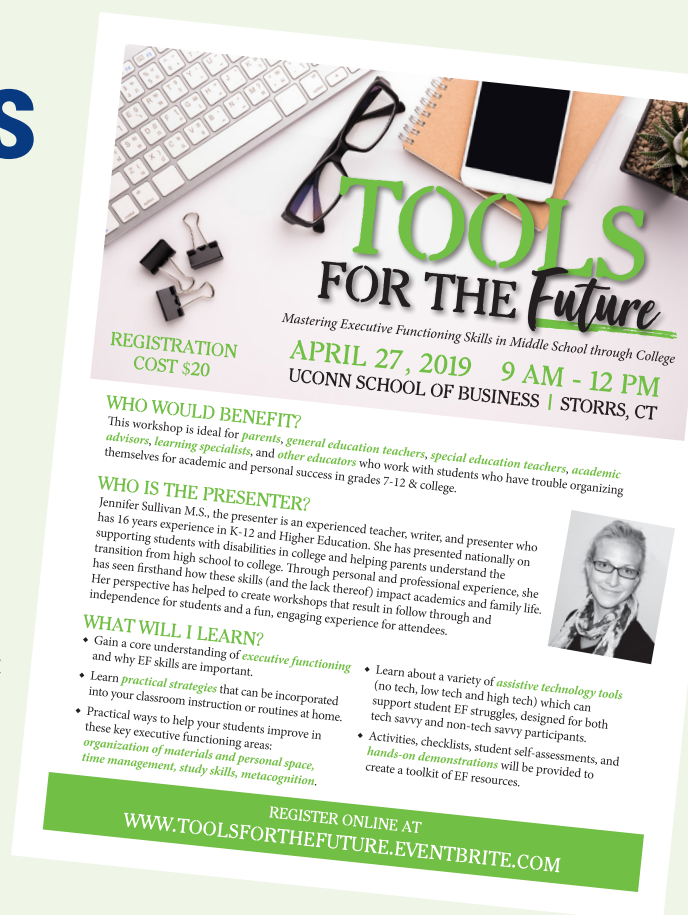
Strengthening Student Self-Advocacy:
